Office of Recording Secretary

Duties and Responsibilities

The Recording Secretary is expected to be present at all monthly Board, regular membership and special meetings. They must notify the President or the Vice President, 24 hours prior to any meeting, of their inability to attend.

Primary duty is to record the minutes of club functions at the Board Meeting, Regular Membership Meeting each month and any special meeting as may be called by the President. To keep accurate records and to keep and maintain a permanent "Meeting Minutes" file.

To provide a copy of the Minutes to the President and Board Members as soon as feasible following each recorded meeting. Minutes should be disbursed through electronic media methods.

Provide a copy of the current minutes, to the bulletin editor for publication in the monthly newsletter. (Hill and Gully Pay Dirt) Minutes must be in an electronic media format.

The Recording Secretary position requires proficiency in use of computer word processing programs such as MS Word, Open Office Write, Apple Write or other compatible software package. They must have Internet access and able to send and receive documents through any acceptable and compatible e-mail program.

Palmdale Gem and Mineral Club Office of Corresponding Secretary Duties and Despensibilities

Duties and Responsibilities

The Corresponding Secretary is expected to be present at all monthly Board, regular membership and special meetings. They must notify the President or the Vice President, 24 hours prior to any meeting, of their inability to attend. Should be prepared to present whatever information is required at each meeting as applicable.

The Corresponding Secretary shall handle the correspondence of the club. Is responsible for the pick-up of mail at the P. O. Box, and for paying the P. O. Box rental fee when due. (Submit a voucher to the Treasurer for required funds). All mail will be picked-up regularly, sorted and read or presented at the monthly Board or General Meeting as is applicable. Deliver to Committee Heads any mail applicable to the committee.

Donations to the CFMS and AFMS Scholarship Funds are due in January of each year. It is the responsibility of the Corresponding Secretary to send donations to the respective scholarship funds as directed by the Scholarship Committee Head and approved by the Board of Directors. An additional duty is to send the annual renewal of the CFMS News¬letter Subscriptions for the club in January of each year to the CFMS. The form is available in the January issue of the CFMS Newsletter.
